


Brief about Pharmacy Council of India (PCI)


The Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) is a statutory body constituted under the Pharmacy Act, 1948. The Act was passed by the Parliament to make better provisions for the regulation of the profession and practice of pharmacy throughout the country.

* The main objectives of the PCI are

- 1. To prescribe minimum standard of education required for qualifying as a pharmacist i.e. framing of Education Regulations prescribing the conditions to be fulfilled by the institutions seeking approval of the PCI for imparting education in pharmacy.
- 2. To ensure uniform implementation of the educational standards throughout the country.
- 3. To approve the courses of study and examination for pharmacists i.e. approval of the academic training institutions providing pharmacy courses.
- 4. To withdraw approval, if the approved course of study or an approved examination does not continue to be in conformity with the educational standards prescribed by the PCI.
- 5. To approve qualifications granted outside the territories to which the Pharmacy Act extends i.e. the approval of foreign qualifications.
- 6. To maintain the Central Register of Pharmacists on the basis of data forwarded by the State Pharmacy Councils.



Drug Summery Tulasi



Ocimum tenuiflorum, commonly known as **holy basil** or **tulsi** or **tulsi**, is an aromatic perennial plant. Tulsi or Holy basil is a widely known herb in the family Lamiaceae. It is native to India and vastly cultivated throughout Southeast Asia. Tulsi has a special place in Ayurveda as well as the home of Hindus in India. It is considered sacred by Hindus and worshipped by them. Three main types of Tulsi are seen growing in India:

- 1. Bright green leaves called Ram Tulsi
- 2. Purplish green leaves called Krishna Tulsi
- 3. Common wild Vana Tulsi.

Tulsi has proved to be highly effective in protecting our body from various infections and diseases of the liver, skin, kidney, etc. It contains powerful oxidants that can help in keeping your blood pressure levels and cholesterol levels under control, making it one of the best heart-healthy foods. It is also good for diabetes as it possesses hypoglycaemic properties which are known to help lower blood sugar levels. It is recommended to include tulsi in your diabetic diet plan. Owing to its numerous health benefits, tulsi is rightly called the 'Queen of Herbs'. Research suggests that tulsi may have anti-inflammatory properties, which can help reduce inflammation in the body. Tulsi may help lower blood sugar levels and improve insulin sensitivity in individuals with type 2 diabetes. It have adaptogenic properties, meaning it can help the body adapt to stress and promote overall well-being. The plant and oil its contain diverse phytochemicals, including tannins, flavonoids, eugenol, caryophyllenes, carva crol, linalool, camphor, and cinnamyl acetate, among others.

Pharmaceutical Drugs



"A drug is A substance recognized by an official pharmacopoeia or formulary. A substance intended for use in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease. A substance (other than food) intended to affect the structure or any function of the body". Or may be A drug is any chemical substance other than a nutrient or an essential dietary ingredient, which, when administered to a living organism, produces a biological effect. In pharmacology, a drug is a chemical substance, typically of known structure, which, when administered to a living organism, produces a biological effect. A pharmaceutical drug, also called a medication or medicine, is a chemical substance used to treat, cure, prevent, or diagnose a disease or to promote wellbeing. Traditionally drugs were obtained through extraction from medicinal plants, but more recently also by organic synthesis. Pharmaceutical drugs may be used for a limited duration, or on a regular basis for chronic disorders In English, the noun "drug" is thought to originate from Old French "drogue", possibly deriving from "droge (vate)" from Middle Dutch meaning "dry (barrels)", referring to medicinal plants preserved as dry matter in barrels Pharmaceutical drugs are usually categorised into drug classes. A group of drugs will share a similar chemical structure, or have the same mechanism of action, the same related mode of action or target the same illness or related illnesses

Food and Drug Administration (FDA)



The United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA or US FDA) is a federal agency of the Department of Health and Human Services. The FDA is responsible for protecting and promoting public health through the control and supervision of food safety, tobacco products, caffeine products, dietary

supplements, prescription and over-the-counter pharmaceutical

drugs (medications), vaccines, biopharmaceuticals, blood transfusions, medical devices, electromagnetic radiation emitting devices (ERED), cosmetics, animal foods feed and veterinary products. The FDA's primary focus is enforcement of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (FD&C). However, the agency also enforces other laws, notably Section 361 of the Public Health Service Act as well as associated regulations. Much of this regulatory-enforcement work is not directly related to food or drugs but involves other factors like regulating lasers, cellular phones. The FDA is led by the Commissioner of Food and Drugs, appointed by the President with the advice and consent of the Senate. The Commissioner reports to the Secretary of Health and Human Services. Robert Califf is the current Commissioner as of 17 February 2022. The FDA's headquarters is located in the White Oak area of Silver Spring, Maryland. The agency has 223 field offices and 13 laboratories located across the 50 states, the United States Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico.In 2008, the FDA began to post employees to foreign countries, including China, India, Costa Rica, Chile, Belgium, and the United Kingdom.




Art of Living Session


